FUN CURRICULUM



We are registered with Munch & Move, which is an NSW Health initiative that supports the healthy development of children birth to 5 years by promoting physical activity, healthy eating. Munch & Move offers training and resources to educators working in NSW early childhood education and care services. We use Munch & Move training aims to assist educators to implement a fun, play-based approach to supporting healthy eating and physical activity habits in young children.



We incorporate cosmic yoga in our curriculum, which make yoga adventures and help children to build their mental and physical strength and confidence. Toddlers Room Program (Age group 2 to 3 year)

WE ARE HELPING TODDLERS WITH FOLLOWING LEARNING EXPERIENCES





Pouring, scoping, and transferring- we encourage everyday skills like spooning, pouring, and transferring, these skills involve both small and big muscle movements, as well as toddler ability to think about what they are doing.



Fabric clothes and smell bottles-Our sensorial learning experiences for toddlers involve wide range of materials which allow children to play with fabric clothes to sense the texture and sound cylinders to match sounds.




Colour sorting- In toddlers routine, we provide an opportunity to children for sorting materials, colours, and shapes. Sorting is a rich curriculum to facilitate children natural ability of maths and problem-solving skills.



Easel Painting- Our toddlers' group enjoy the fun of easel painting. Our easel is on the level of toddlers age which allow them to learn how to manage the paint and they will go through a variety of stages in the process including mixing, expressing, and creating.



Before sleep reading- We read books everyday with children which is meaningful and based on education.



OUR LANDSCPAE



This month and upcoming months, educators and children working to grow our garden with flowers and vegetable. Gardening is a terrific way to get children involved with nature. It has the power to teach children about the beauty of flowers and vegetables, whilst also teaching them valuable life lessons like patience and self-confidence. Preschool Room Program 3 to 5 years

WE ARE HELPING PRE-SCHOOLERS WITH FOLLOWING LEARNING EXPERIENCES





Smell bottles and Baric tablets- These two activities are coming under the sensorial curriculum, which introduces to aware children about the various smells and weighing the tiles to identify which is heavy and lighter.



Latch Lock- The lock learning task teaches logical thinking and decision-making skills and gives the child a sense of self confidence when they get it right. It also teaches the child self-correction as they can see and hear for themselves when the locks or latches don't engage correctly.



Sandpaper letter- With the property of the sandpaper, the child feels the shape of the letters. This prepares the child to write. This set is also used to introduce the child the letter sound.



AFTER MONTESSORI PROGRAM

An eBook- We incorporate eBook in a preschool classroom in afternoon time or before rest time. Children read and watch this eBook through various media such as projector, PowerPoint presentation or iPad.



Preschool writing tools- We offer children various writing tools which they can access throughout the day. our writing tools include crayons, markers, pencils, pens, and pencil colours





Much of the Montessori curriculum is based on giving children exposure to concrete materials first, then giving them incremental opportunities to work to more abstract concepts. This is no different when it comes to math. Through concrete materials children can hold a material in their hands. The materials are symbolic or representative of something else (a number, perhaps), and that symbolism changes over time until children are ready to let go of the materials and find solutions on paper or even in their heads. This idea of mastering a skill without the assistance of materials is what we refer to as abstraction.
